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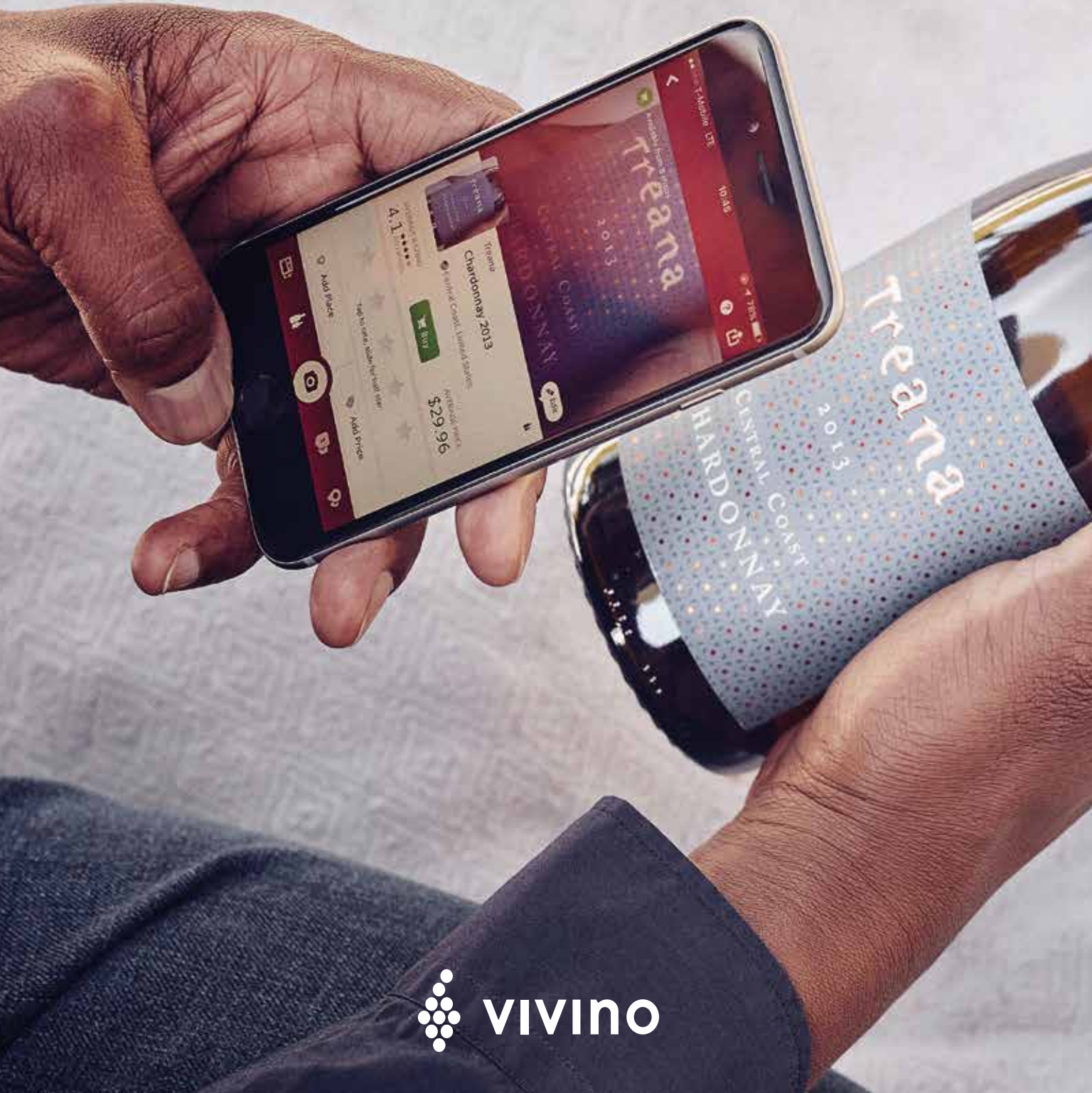

We applaud both Duncan and Ashley who have led by example and inspired thousands along the way. In a time where it is easy to be consumed by the negative, to feel

that one person can't make a difference, these individuals help us all believe in the innate goodness of humanity and the capacity for each of us to change our community and our world for the better.

Our Spotlight on Tony Goldwyn will highlight his career and deep commitment to Americares. This incredible organization saves lives and improves the health of people affected by poverty or disaster so they can reach their full potential. 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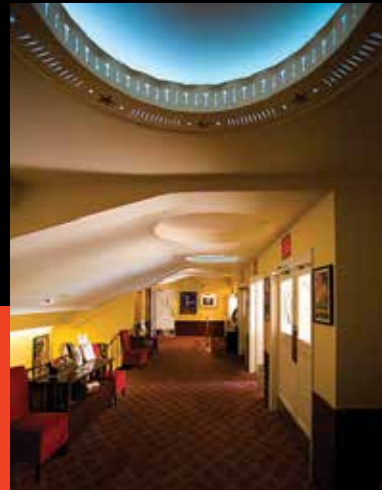
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A Note from Programming

Greetings GIFF Friends and Family,

This year has really flown by, and we can't believe we are already on our fourth edition of this Festival. Sam and I have been thrilled to work together again and are honored to share the voices of some of the greatest domestic and international storytellers with you.

In an effort to continue our year-round programming, we had the pleasure of holding several complimentary advance screenings for our community in the Fall and Winter which included *Breathe*, *Danica*, *In The Fade*, *Nostalgia*, *Beirut*, and *Disobedience* at Bow Tie Cinemas. After screening hundreds of submissions, the programming team traveled to Sundance in search of the best of the best in filmmaking on the festival circuit. In March, our team spent a week at SXSW curating films to round out what has shaped into a program that we are tremendously proud of and excited to share with our community.

Given that we are a female-founded Film Festival and due to the current climate in the entertainment industry, Sam and I made a commitment to selecting a lineup of half female written or directed films. We will showcase some of these inspiring ladies on our panel, "Women at the Helm: A Discussion About Female Directors."

In order to achieve a delicate balance and cohesive line-up of films in our slate each year, we have to give careful consideration to programming films that share diverse stories from around the world. We are thrilled that 14 countries are represented in the 2018 program which include: The United States, Netherlands, Denmark, Brazil, Hungary, Germany, Belgium, France, Ghana, The United Kingdom, Lebanon, Austria, Switzerland, and Norway.

We are pleased to say that we've raised the bar this year with our unbelievable Opening Night Film, *The Price of Everything*, directed by Nathaniel Kahn. *The Price of Everything* is an eye-opening documentary feature which investigates the labyrinth of the contemporary art world, forcing the viewer to reevaluate the relationship between art and consumerism. Featuring collectors, dealers, auctioneers and a rich range of artists, from current market darlings Jeff Koons, Gerhard Richter and Njideka Akunyili Crosby, to one-time art star Larry Poons. Following this spectacular film will be a Q&A with filmmakers and industry professionals from the art world.

We also have the pleasure of sharing with you several Centerpiece Films in our line-up. From Hungarian first-time documentary director, Bernadett Tuza-Ritter, comes *A Woman Captured*, a captivating and harrowing film that profiles a domestic slave and the unbearable oppression that she endures for ten years. Our second Centerpiece, *Eighth Grade*, is a funny and poignant Narrative Feature debut written and directed by Bo Burnham centering on a 13-year-old girl struggling to navigate her disastrous eighth grade year. Eye-opening documentary, *The Dawn Wall*, directed by Josh Lowell and Peter Mortimer, profiles legendary free-climber Tommy Caldwell. And finally, *1985*, a tender and impactful Narrative Feature directed by Yen Tan that explores the struggles of a closeted young man in 1980's rural America.

Our other 44 documentary and narrative shorts and feature films are outstanding this year as well. Our films explore subject matter from global healthcare, racial injustice, bullying, and modern slavery, to gun control, LGBT rights, the refugee crisis, child labor, global poverty, genocide awareness, mental health, environmental protection, disabilities, and female empowerment.

In addition to our beautiful and inspiring films, our panels include, two Spotlight On conversations with Oscar Award Winning Director, Writer, and Producer James Ivory, and Actor, Producer, Director, and Political Activist, Tony Goldwyn. Additionally, JP Morgan will be presenting a panel discussion examining "The Changing Face of Film Distribution."

We hope that you enjoy the program and connect with the stories of our filmmakers and panelists as much as we have over the past 9 months. We anticipate that they will inspire change in the world, and that you will walk away with a shift in perspective and a new sense of awareness about the struggles that people face on a global level.

Sam and I thank the GIFF team for their patience and support, our fantastic Jury of entertainment professionals for their time and efforts in helping us select the winners of each competitive category, our Pre-screening Committee and interns who spent thousands of hours of their time reviewing and rating films, our volunteers, our loving families, and all of you, who have trusted our taste and taken a leap with us.

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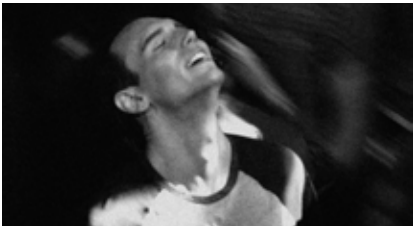

Recently single, Korean-born LA artist Sophia Lee devotes herself to her public performance art, whether it's a provocative Korean perspective in the park on the LA Riots or quirky digital art on social media. To pay the bills, she does odd jobs for TaskRabbit. When a filmmaker reaches out to discuss an acting role in his film, she is excited to explore the opportunity, only to realize he can't distinguish between her art and her real-life identity. Meanwhile, when a stranger makes Sophia late for a TaskRabbit gig, she loses her temper with her, only to run into her repeatedly and discover a strong connection. 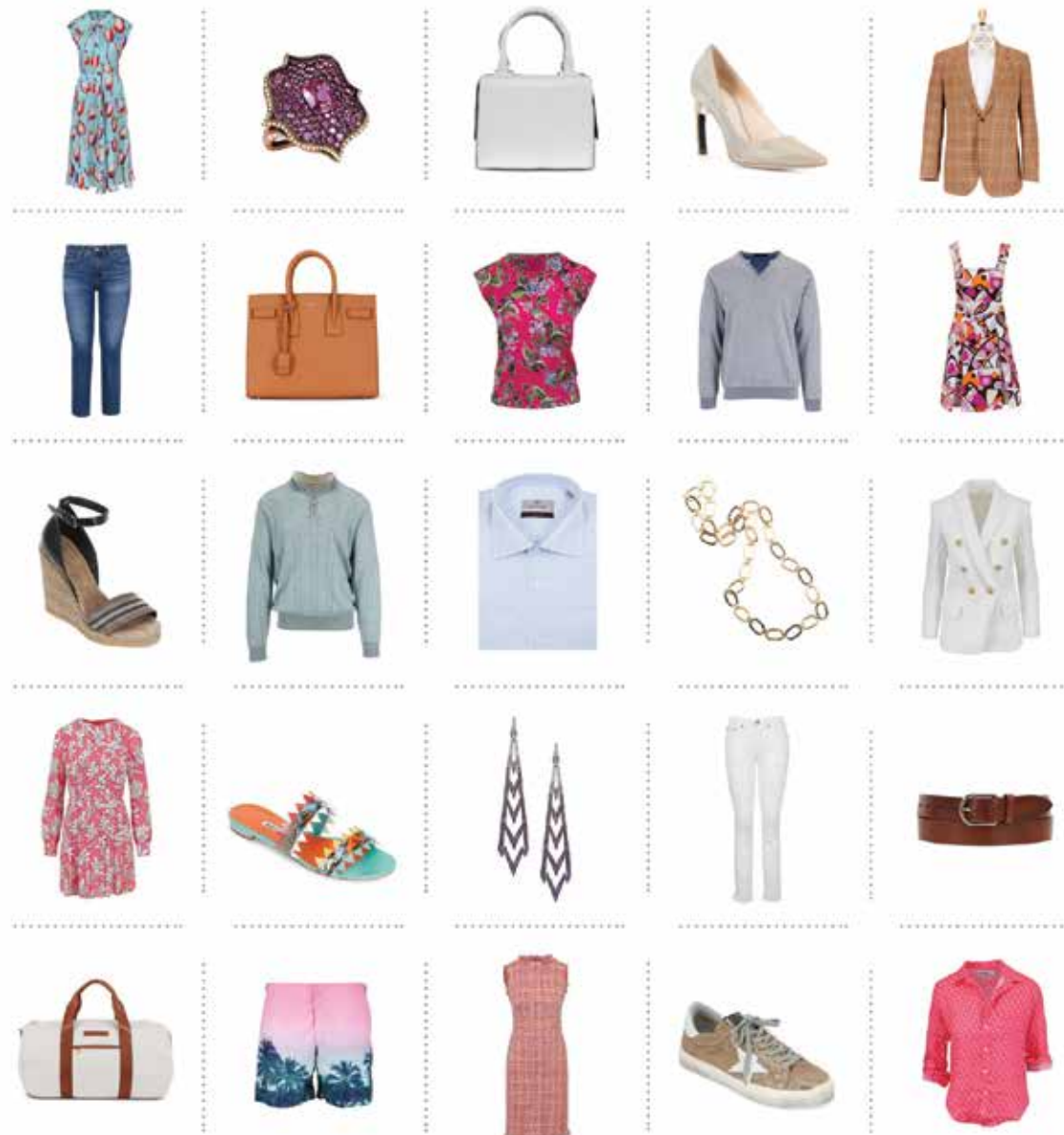
