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A letter from the Chairwoman

Welcome to the 10th year of the Greenwich International Film Festival. I am so proud of what we have been able to accomplish during this decade of impact for our community and our world. Over the past decade, we have had many accomplishments. We were the first film festival to program 50 percent of our film lineup with films written or directed by women. We have stayed true to our founding mission to use film as a vehicle to inspire and educate. We have raised over 1.2 million dollars for local and national charity partners, positively impacting the lives of marginalized and underrepresented people, at home and around the world. We have awarded hundreds of thousands of dollars to filmmakers and have become known as the preeminent spot to premiere social impact films, due to our thoughtful panel programming and the dynamic ways we are able to create meaningful discussions inspired by film.

Over the years we have addressed issues ranging from wrongful incarceration, women's rights, gun control, mental health, the environment, equal access to education, immigration, and many more allowing for discourse on topics that sometimes seem too polarizing even to discuss these days.

This year our theme has been to use film to combat antisemitism. In this terrifying world, GIFF has always proudly stood as an anti-hate organization. There is no room for civil discourse when hate is present and the inability to have civil discourse with one another can have dire consequences. At GIFF, we believe that all humans are born with an inalienable right to give and receive love and to feel safe; regardless of their sexual orientation, ethnicity, religion, or nationality.

More than twenty years ago, in a classroom in Ann Arbor Michigan, I spent every Tuesday speaking with a Holocaust survivor as part of a class I was taking through my University. That class was the greatest catalyst for cementing my firm belief that it is only through the power of sharing our stories that we can break the cycle of hate and destruction. If you allow yourself to listen to other people's stories, if you allow yourself to know



them, it is almost impossible to hate them. Film is a vehicle that allows us to let our nervous systems relax and to listen. In this way, I believe film serves an essential role in the dignified survival of humanity.

I think at this time in our history it is more important than ever to lean into our shared humanity and to remember that which unites us is far greater than that which divides us.

At this year's gala, we are thrilled to honor Jessica and Jerry Seinfeld, who are our dream #decadeofimpact Changemaker honorees. They have relentlessly used their platforms to lift others up and to change the course of the lives of those less fortunate. We have long been looking to celebrate comedians, who use their platforms in service to others and make us laugh along the way. What greater gift is there than laughter to elevate us all and bring us joy?

I am forever grateful to our team, most notably our Executive Director, Ginger Stickel, who has stayed with this organization since its inception, guiding us through the COVID-19 crisis, the crisis within our industry, and structural changes within our organization. We would not be here celebrating our 10th year without her dedication. Thank you also to all of our staff who have been here since the beginning particularly Lauren Clayton, and Sebastian Dostman. Thank you to Alicia Pipher, Heather Raftery, and Helen Haberman and to all our volunteers and interns. Thank you to our amazing board of directors, many of whom have been with us since the beginning. Thank you to our donors, supporters, committee members, and event attendees.

Together we have built something remarkable. I am extraordinarily grateful for your belief in us.







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




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A letter from Executive Director, Ginger Stickel

As we commemorate a decade of impact at Greenwich International Film Festival (GIFF), it strikes me that we are very fortunate to be able to celebrate this exciting, challenging, and enlightening journey together. GIFF is the result of many people who believe that film is a powerful medium that can create positive social change. Thanks to our visionary founding members and supportive Board, generous patrons and enthusiastic audience members, dedicated team and reliable volunteers, talented filmmakers and inspiring honorees, we've built an organization that harnesses the power of film to serve the greater good in Connecticut and beyond. I'm proud to share that our efforts have led GIFF to receive the 2024 Connecticut Governor's Arts Award.

As an all-female-founded-and-run non-profit organization, it's been important to us to showcase female talent. This year, we hosted our Women's Film Series in March which included the world premiere of LOSING GRACE, FINDING HOPE, directed by Marcia Carroll, a documentary that seeks to spread awareness about the growing epidemic of suicide by shining a light on the loved ones left behind. We also held GIFF's first-ever Writer's Inspiration Talk & Award Ceremony, honoring award-winning author and filmmaker, Rebecca Miller, who grew up and attended college in Connecticut.

GIFF's Best Social Impact Film Award, which has been generously underwritten by Ann Young for 10 years, comes with a cash prize that has allowed filmmakers to cover marketing campaigns, donate to causes that are highlighted in their films, and start fundraising for their next project. This year's Best Social Impact Film winner is 999 THE FORGOTTEN GIRLS, directed by Heather Dune McAdam, a film about the first 999 female prisoners at Auschwitz. We hosted an important Q&A afterward with the filmmaker and several descendants of the women who survived Auschwitz. Given the recent rise in antisemitism, we expanded our Jewish Film Series, thanks in large part to Rebecca Colin, Phd and the Eve & Simon Colin Family Foundation. Perhaps the most notable event in the series was our Tribute to Sir Nicholas Winton which featured a special screening of ONE LIFE, followed by a Q&A with Winton's family members and KinderTransport survivors celebrating his heroic efforts to save 669 Jewish children during the Holocaust.

GIFF has been proud to screen our films at independent theaters like Avon Theatre and Bedford Playhouse. These theaters are critical to the arts in our community. This year, our monthly film series at the Avon featured inspiring films like SING



SING, based on the true story of incarcerated inmates who find purpose through a prison theater program. The screening was followed by a Q&A with the charity featured in the film, Rehabilitation Through The Arts (RTA).

Over the past decade GIFF has raised over \$1.2 million for charity partners. Our proceeds have been used to provide new equipment for ABILIS, mental health initiatives for Family Centers, a weekend meal program for Filling in the Blanks, workforce development programs at Building One Community, and so much more. This year, GIFF will support the Children's Museum of Manhattan Family Connections program, which reunites parents incarcerated on Rikers Island and their children for an afternoon of play and learning at the museum to strengthen parent-child bonds and reduce recidivism.

One of the ways we've been able to support so many charities is through Changemakers like Jerry & Jessica Seinfeld. They exemplify the type of humanitarians we like to honor - those who lead by example and impact positive social change through their philanthropic endeavors. Thank you, Jerry & Jessica for speaking out against antisemitism, for the incredible work you do through the Good+ Foundation, for your social impact films like DAUGHTERS, and for making people laugh during a challenging time.

GIFF would not be possible if it weren't for our steadfast community of supporters, especially Wendy Stapleton (Chairwoman), Laura Kutnick (Chair of Film Selection), the GIFF Board, our Host Committee chaired by Kate Clark, Kim Habul & Victoria Triplett, and our valued team members: Alicia Pipher, Lauren Clayton, Sebastian Dostmann, and Heather Raftery. To everyone who has shared their time, talent and support along the way, thank you for helping GIFF #MakeAnImpact!

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


Congratulations to the 2024 film award recipients!

GIFF held the Virtual Film Award Ceremony on Wednesday, May 15th. 999 THE FORGOTTEN GIRLS, directed by Heather Macadam, received the Best Social Impact Film Award which includes a \$10,000 cash prize, generously underwritten by Ann & Nick Young. Honorable Mention for Narrative Feature was awarded to ÀMA GLORIA, directed by Marie Amachoukeli. Honorable Mention for Documentary Feature was awarded to LUCHA: A WRESTLING TALE, directed by Marco Ricci.



GIFF was proud to partner with Heather Gaudio Fine Art on, "A Conversation with Michael Dweck," on, April 10th from 6 to 8 p.m. During the event, the award-winning filmmaker and visual artist spoke about his documentary, THE LAST RACE, which inspired Blunderbust, the powerful new collection of his paintings which were exhibited at the gallery in Greenwich through June 1st. In advance of the event, GIFF hosted a virtual screening of the film, which takes viewers on a cinematic journey into the world of stock car racing. Through the film's poetic blend of images, music and sound design, Dweck drives the viewer close to the spirit of the stock car community.









Jerry & Jessica Seinfeld 2024 Changemakers

Jerry Seinfeld's comedy career took off after his first appearance on The Tonight Show with Johnny Carson in 1981. Eight years later, he teamed up with fellow comedian Larry David to create what was to become the most successful comedy series in the history of television: Seinfeld. The show ran on NBC for nine seasons, winning numerous Emmy, Golden Globe and People's Choice awards, was named the greatest television show of all time in 2009 by TV Guide, and in 2012 was identified as the best sitcom ever in a 60 Minutes/Vanity Fair poll.

His latest Emmy nominated Netflix projects include Jerry Before Seinfeld and 23 Hours to Kill along with the highly acclaimed web series, Comedians in Cars Getting Coffee. Seinfeld has also starred in, written, and produced movies (Comedian, Bee Movie), directed and produced a Broadway hit (Colin Quinn: Long Story Short), and wrote three best-selling books (Is this Anything?, The Comedians in Cars Getting Coffee Book, and Seinlanguage) and a children's book (Halloween). He stars in the Emmy-nominated comedy film, Unfrosted, which he directed, co-wrote, and produced. Seinfeld continues to perform both nationally and internationally.

Jessica Seinfeld is the New York Times bestselling author of six cookbooks. She is founder and chair of the board of Good+Foundation, a leading national nonprofit that works to dismantle multigenerational poverty by pairing tangible goods with innovative services for low-income parents and caregivers, creating an upward trajectory for the whole family. She recently executive produced the Netflix documentary Daughters. She lives in Manhattan with her husband, comedian Jerry Seinfeld, and their three children.

Jane Shang

A current Greenwich resident, Jane Dawson Shang recently co-produced Where I Became, a moving documentary about the incredible journey of 14 young women who left Apartheid South Africa in the '80s and '90s to attend Smith College. Jane graduated from Smith College, with a double major in Economics and Art History, and later pursued graduate studies in Japan, 1984-85. Her career in Finance included overseas posts with husband Paul Shang, in Tokyo, Hong Kong, and London, before moving back to the US in 2003, and settling in Greenwich with children Matthew and Margot Shang. Passionate about education and the arts, Jane's volunteer commitments have included the Hong Kong Philharmonic Orchestra, Charities for Thomas's School, Kensington, City Year, UK, and the Posse Foundation, along with many volunteer positions at Brunswick School and Greenwich Academy. She currently serves on the vestry at St. Barnabas Church of Greenwich, and spends time working between the US and South Africa with her co-producer, Tandiwe Njobe, on screening and film distribution opportunities for Where I Became.



Joe Massa

Joe Massa is a 34-year-old Greenwich filmmaker originally from West Haven, CT. Since Joe was young, he has always had an affinity for film. As he grew older, Joe continued to become more acquainted with the technicalities of filmmaking by spending hundreds of hours studying and learning the intricacies of every aspect of the craft. In 2018, Joe created an interview-style docuseries called, My Suicide Story, during which he interviewed survivors of attempted suicide and offered a platform for these individuals to share their stories of survival and triumph over their attempts. The series has been featured in several national publications and has amassed millions of views, collectively, across YouTube and TikTok. In 2022, Joe was nominated to the CT 40 under 40: Class of 2022 and was also featured on Nyberg for his work on the series. Currently, Joe is in the finishing stages of a short documentary film titled, Injustice: The Gabby Murillo Story. The film follows a young woman from Joe's hometown who, at 22, was paralyzed by a drunk driver while interning for the Disney College Program and is unable to pursue legal action due to the negligence of Florida's legal system. Joe's scope of work and artistic vision focuses on helping others and has contributed to the fight against suicide.



Peter H. Gistelinck


Mr. Gistelinck is the Executive Director of the Avon Theatre - Deborah & Chuck Royce Cinema Arts Center in Stamford, CT since July 1, 2023. Prior to joining the Avon, he served as the Executive Director of the Wharton Institute for the Performing Arts (2019-2023), President & CEO of the Kalamazoo Symphony Orchestra (2014-2019) and Executive Director of The Chamber Orchestra of Philadelphia (2006-2014). Prior to immigrating to the USA in 2006, Mr. Gistelinck was Director of Sales and Marketing and Co-Artistic Director for the Brussels Philharmonic Orchestra in Belgium and General Manager of Business Affairs for Le Concert Spirituel in Paris, France.

For more than 30 years, Mr. Gistelinck has made a difference within the overall entertainment industry, not only as a seasoned arts administrator and turnaround professional, but also as an accomplished producer, composer and orchestrator. As a graduate of the State University of Ghent, Belgium, Mr. Gistelinck earned a MA in Musicology and a BA in History of Arts, respectively. Prior to earning his degrees, he graduated from the Royal Music Conservatory of Ghent. Mr. Gistelinck also holds the 'Executive Certificate in Leadership' from the Jack Welch Management Institute at Strayer University and the 'Business of Change Certificate' from Columbia Business School at Columbia University. He speaks Flemish/Dutch, French, English and German. Mr. Gistelinck currently serves as a member of the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (aka The Recording Academy/Grammy Awards), Santa Monica, CA; International Academy of Jazz @ University of Pittsburgh, PA; International Society for the Performing Arts (ISPA), New York, NY; American Film Institute (AFI), Los Angeles, CA; and the Alliance Française of Westchester, NY. He is also a Founding Board Member of the Marvin Hamlisch International Music Awards in addition to his affiliations with several music publishing and author rights organizations.



Ann Bresnan Young

Philanthropist Ann Bresnan Young has worked in finance, real estate, and at Christie's auction house. She has invested in both films and art. Ann and a good friend produced Thank You Films – a series of 30-second public service announcements aired nationwide for several years on cable networks aimed at thanking individual charities for the many good works they do and drawing a wider awareness to their causes. Currently, she is the President of the Bill and Ann Bresnan Foundation and believes strongly in the positive role films can play in changing lives.



999 THE FORGOTTEN GIRLS

USA / 90 MIN / DOCUMENTARY

The first official Jewish transport to Auschwitz consisted of 999 Slovak girls and young women. This documentary features several survivors from that transport. Best-selling author and historian Heather Dune Macadam has adapted her acclaimed book 999 into a powerful new documentary that sheds light on a wrenching true story. In March 1942, nearly 1,000 young Slovak Jewish women, mostly teenagers, told by their government that they were embarking on a volunteer work assignment, were instead illegally deported to Auschwitz on what was the first Jewish transport to the Nazi death camp. Rather than strictly focus on the suffering and death experienced by most of the girls, Macadam tells stories of a small group who survived against all odds, even under unimaginable conditions that lasted more than three grueling years. A film of deep research and vivid detail, 999: The Forgotten Girls ensures that these women will no longer be a historical footnote. Note: some images may be disturbing.

Children's Museum of Manhattan


This year, Greenwich International Film Festival is thrilled to support the Children's Museum of Manhattan Family Connections Program, with proceeds from the Changemaker Gala.



In 2018, the Children's Museum of Manhattan created a first-of-its-kind program in partnership with the NYC Mayor's Office and the Department of Correction to unite mothers incarcerated at Rikers Island with their children for an afternoon of play, learning, and bonding at the Museum when it is closed to the public. Today, early success of the program has led to an expansion that provides Museum visits for fathers incarcerated at Rikers Island and the installation of CMOM learning hubs at all eight family centers on-Island, which serve 50,000 visitors annually. Together, these initiatives provide parents incarcerated with opportunities to reconnect with their young children through facilitated programming in a supportive, non-institutional setting.

In 2023, the DOC conducted a formal evaluation of the program, which found that for incarcerated mothers, participation in CMOM site visits is correlated with improved behavior at Rikers, as fewer uses of force and infraction were reported before and after CMOM visits. They observed that visitation allows mothers and children to maintain their connection in a suitable environment that may foster and strengthen the relationship, benefiting both mother and child. Therefore, it was concluded that visitation during incarceration "is essential for successful reentry and increases positive outcomes between mother and child following the mother's incarceration."

A child's need for a stable, secure relationship with a caregiver underscores their future healthy development of a myriad of physical, cognitive, social, and emotional skills. Maintaining family connections when appropriate for children and parents incarcerated is a crucial step in supporting these families, reducing the trauma of incarceration, and taking a critical step on the path to reducing nation-wide recidivism.

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


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
